## Commander's Comments



Well, here we go again. Another two months come and gone. A lot has happened in the last two months. State convention has come and gone. Just to let everyone know what happened at the convention. There was a discussion on the dues increase for annual membership. National this year will pass at convention a dues increase of \$10.00 a year for annual membership. 70% of the dues increase will go straight to the state service offices to help fund there budget needs. The posts will have to eventually raise there dues to the membership to match national due to the fact that the post will get charged the increase and it is up to the post to increase as well or they will be paying the increase and a lot of the posts cannot afford the increase without raising their fees as well. Think of it this way, national does a \$10.00 increase and the state has 70,000 members of which 40,000 are annual members. This comes out to a \$400,000.00 increase that the state now pays to national so in turn the state increases the district dues \$10.00 per annual member. Just one of the districts, using our as an example, has 6,000 members of which 3,000 are annual members. That is a increase of \$30,000.00 to the district. Now the district raises their dues to the post \$10.00 per annual member and the post, using ours for the example has 324 members and out of that there are 150 annual members. The post then has to pay district \$1500.00 for their dues. So then the post has to raise their dues to cover the increase from national. So once again it is a trickle affect to the membership. But it is a change that with an increase in the need for our veterans to get medical help for PTSD and other ailments that come from war. So the increase will go to national and they will pass it at convention and it will go in affect for the 2014 financial year. Now for some post news. A lot has been going on at the post some good and some bad. Once again we have things going on that involve people and their personal lives. All I ask is that when you have an opinion of something that someone does in their personal life and you don't agree with it; please take them to the side and discuss the issue with them. I hear people yell and swear at members for something that has happened and it is in front of the customers in the canteen. If you have to say anything to the person (not that it is any of your business) say it in private behind closed doors. If your reading this you know who you are. Remember the lord tells you do unto others as you would have them do unto you. I believe what is meant by this is don't air your dirty laundry in public. What people do in life is their choice to make not yours, whether you agree with it or not. Some people believe I should say something but I am here to tell you it is not my place as your commander to get involved with peoples personal lives. 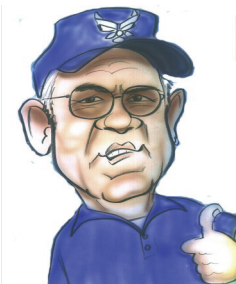
