

Hospital Services and Surgeon Corner

Currently we have 2 wheelchairs, a couple of walkers, crutches, canes and an adjustable cushion for a wheelchair or chair. We also have a lift chair available for someone in need.

This month we distributed a lift chair, a wheelchair, two walkers, a mobility scooter and one of the adjustable cushions.

Home repair and modification assistance.

We have two programs available to veterans that need help around the home.

First is a program offered through the Veterans Administration known as Home Health Assistance. This non-medical aid in the home is available to any veteran that has a VA disability rating. You see your VA primary care physician and ask him to write the prescription to get a HHA contractor in to your home for a set number of hours a week to help with cooking, shopping, cleaning, washing, rides to appointments and such. It is not for medical assistance. You can get this even if you have a spouse that is your normal care giver.

We currently have two veterans receiving this assistance in the area.

The second program is offered to veterans through the folks at Habitat for Humanity. They have two separate programs. They currently have some grant money good through the end of September to be used to modify homes to improve accessibility and living conditions. This is offered at no cost to the veteran and there are no prerequisites to speak of. They have installed a wheelchair ramp for one of our vets already and have a good chunk of the grant left.

The second program from Habitat is one that offers home repairs at no cost for the labor using volunteer contractors and technicians. The veteran would be responsible to pay for the materials.

Veterans Housing Rehabilitation and Modification Program (VHRMP) Fact Sheet

Purpose: To meet the needs of the veterans in our community by making critical home repairs and modifications to keep veterans in Sheboygan County safe and preserve their home assets.

Exterior: Replace/repair steps, decks, railings, ramps, exterior doors, windows, siding/sheathing, trim, fascia, gutter boards, downspouts; paint; weatherization and insulation Interior: Replace/repair interior doors, ceilings, walls, and floors/flooring Accessibility: Grab bars, ramps, accessible kitchens and bathrooms

You may qualify the program if you can answer yes to the following questions:

- Are you a veteran with a general or honorable discharge, any year, from any branch of service?
- 2. Do you own and occupy a single-family home in Sheboygan County?
- 3. Are your house payments up to date?
- 4. Do you have a homeowners insurance policy in effect?
- 5. Is your home in need of critical repairs?
- 6. Will you work with Habitat Lakeside staff & volunteers to facilitate the home repairs?
- 7. Does your income fall within these guidelines?
